Library Presence in LMS

- Learning Management System
 - Desire 2 Learn replaces ELM for Fall 2010
 - New Name! “Avenue to Learn” or “Avenue”; Sandbox available June 18
- Include a librarian in your course! He/she can:
 - Add content such as library assignments and library presentations
 - Add contact information and links to electronic resources
 - Participate in discussions

Linking to e-Resources

- Provide links to e-resources such as articles and include them on your course Web pages or online course e.g. ELM
- Want links that are stable over time and that will work both on and off campus

Linking to e-Resources

- Use to create links so that they are accessible
 - Faculty Support/Linking to e-Resources <http://library.mcmaster.ca/linking>
 - Library Catalogue records: Permalink
 - Database records: DOI (Digital Object Identifier) or links referred to as Persistent URL, Stable URL, etc.

Creative Commons

"[cc is]...working to revive reasonableness. The freely-available suite of cc licences offers creators a best-of-both-worlds way to protect their works and encourage pre-defined uses by others. The goal is to build a layer of reasonable, flexible copyright in the face of increasingly restrictive default rules."

What's the difference?

Creative Commons License

- State right away what others can do with your work
- Legal license
- Easier to share and build on others' work

Copyright ©

- All rights reserved
- May need extra steps to use/get permissions

- **Attribution** means:
You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your copyrighted work - and derivative works based upon it - but only if they give you credit.
- **Noncommercial** means:
You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform your work - and derivative works based upon it - but for noncommercial purposes only.
- **No Derivative Works** means:
You let others copy, distribute, display, and perform only verbatim copies of your work, not derivative works based upon it.
- **Share Alike** means:
You allow others to distribute derivative works only under a license identical to the license that governs your work.

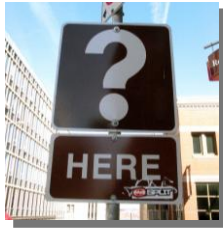
